

Location: Genesis 1-5

Overview: Genesis 1 tells us that in six days God created everything that is seen today. On the seventh day He rested. Genesis 2 focuses on the sixth day and man in particular. We see the fall of man in Genesis 3, and the decline of the human race in Genesis 4-5.

Foreshadow focus: the Sabbath rest of God is a foreshadow of the promise of heaven according to Hebrews 4

Things you need to know: About the creation:

1. We are expected to believe it was a literal event
 - a. It was revealed as a literal event with a literal description
 - b. God spoke about it as a literal event - Exodus 20:11, Isaiah 45:18
 - c. Bible persons believed it to be true:
 - (1) Jesus - Mark 10:6, 13:19
 - (2) Paul - Romans 1:20, Acts 14:15
 - (3) Peter - II Peter 3:4
 - d. It is a matter of faith - Hebrews 11:3
2. All three persons of God were involved in the creation
 - a. The Father - Malachi 2:10
 - b. The Son - John 1:3, Colossians 1:16
 - c. The Holy Spirit - Psalm 104:30, Genesis 1:2
3. Man's nature did not change when he sinned
 - a. Man's nature is created good - Genesis 1:31
 - b. Because it is God's image - Genesis 1:26
 - c. His nature is STILL good - Ecclesiastes 7:29
 - d. Adam proves a good nature does not prevent sin
4. Marriage was created in the Garden of Eden
 - a. Law of Marriage began there - Matthew 19:1-6
