

Location: I Samuel 9 - I Kings 12/II Chronicles 10

Reading Suggestion: I Sam. 15,17

Overview: The last judge, Samuel, anointed Saul of Kish king of Israel. David (of Bethlehem) becomes king afterwards, and then his son Solomon is the last king of the united 12 tribes. This period marks the largest extent of the occupation of the promised land, for 112 years.

Foreshadow focus: David is the embodied foreshadow of the Kingship of Jesus (Ezek. 34:34, Psalm 89, Matthew 22:41-46). His son Solomon ("Peace") is an image of the King of Peace (Isa. 9:6-7). David & Solomon's purchasing and building of the Temple is symbolic of Christ building the church.
