## **Kingdom of Israel**

- I. The Kingdom of Israel
  - A. History The Old Testament
    - 1. Abraham's grandson Jacob received God's promise (Gen. 27)
    - 2. God changed Jacob's name to Israel (Gen. 32:28)
    - 3. Israel had 12 sons that became the 12 tribes of Israel (Gen. 49:28)
    - 4. God made a special covenant with this group 400 years later at Mt. Sinai
      - a. Gave them the Law of Moses
      - b. Gave them the Promised Land (Canaan ⇒Israel)
    - 5. From 1400BC until 960BC there was one Kingdom of Israel
    - 6. From 960BC to 586BC there were two Kingdoms of Israel
      - a. 960BC 722BC Northern Kingdom (aka Israel, Samaria, Ephraim)
      - b. 960BC 586 BC Kingdom of Judah
    - 7. In the time of Jesus there were only the descendants of Judah (the Jews)
  - B. Main point
    - 1. They served as an example of failure 1 Corinthians 10:1-12
      - a. A Broken Vessel of Wrath Romans 9:21-23
      - b. Revealing the sinfulness of sin Romans 7:13
    - 2. They served to provide an authentication of the Messiah Romans 3:2
      - a. Messianic prophecies that spoke of the Messiah
      - b. Many of which were offered prior to the formation of Israel
        - (1) Genesis 12:3, 49:10, Galatians 3:17
    - 3. They served to deliver the Messiah in the flesh Romans 9"5
      - a. The Seed Promise Genesis 22:18, Galatians 3:17
- II. The Kingdom of Christ was God's Eternal Purpose Ephesians 3:10-11
  - A. God's Purpose: Redemption of the Entire Human Race (John 3:16)
    - 1. Not one group alone
    - 2. Ultimate redemption is greater than a physical nation
    - 3. Therefore: promises in Christ are greater than in Moses (Heb. 8:6)
  - B. Israel was NOT a plan gone wrong
    - 1. It was merely a step to getting to the ultimate kingdom
    - 2. The church did not replace Israel
    - 3. Israel foreshadowed the church Colossians 2:17, Hebrews 10:1
  - C. The church as a Spiritual Israel
    - 1. Romans 9:6 "they are not all Israel who are descended from Israel"
    - 2. The Spiritual Reality John 4:22-24
      - a. Worship of Israel was a foreshadow of the things of Christ
      - b. Spiritual things are superior to physical 1 Corinthians 15:46

## III. The Dispensational Error

- A. Premillennial doctrine commonly states:
  - 1. God has never completely fulfilled His promises to Abraham regarding the future of his descendants the nation of Israel (FALSE)
  - 2. Israel never fully inherited Canaan, so this must be accomplished in the millennium after Jesus returns (FALSE)
  - 3. Jesus will reign as earthly king in Palestine, and fleshly Israel will again be God's favored nation (FALSE)

"Passages of the Old Testament ... anticipating a future day of glory for Israel find their fulfillment in the millennial reign of Christ. The regathering of Israel, a prominent theme of most of the prophets, has its purpose realized in the re-establishment of Israel in their ancient land. Israel as a nation is delivered from her persecutors in the time of tribulation and brought into the place of blessing and restoration" – John Walvoord, The Millennial Kingdom, p. 303

- B. Premillennial doctrine is in error on these points
  - 1. God fulfilled ALL Promises to Abraham
    - a. They DID become a great nation Exodus 1:7, 1 Kings 3:7, 4:20
  - 2. Israel received ALL the land promised Joshua 21:43-45
    - a. Many forget God's promise in Deuteronomy 29:25-28
  - 3. Jesus CANNOT reign in Jerusalem in the future
    - a. David's Throne is in Heaven (see previous studies)
    - b. No descendant of David can sit on that throne in Judah (Jeremiah 22:30)
- C. Premillennial doctrine is contrary to the purpose of God
  - 1. It renders Jesus death in vain Galatians 2:21
  - 2. It reinstitutes the division Jesus died to remove Galatians 3:28
  - 3. It re-imposes a sacrificial system that cannot remove sin Hebrews 10:4
- D. Seeking to restore Israel as a particular nation is another Gospel

Galatians 1:8-9 But even if we, or an angel from heaven, should preach to you a gospel contrary to what we have preached to you, he is to be accursed! As we have said before, so I say again now, if any man is preaching to you a gospel contrary to what you received, he is to be accursed!
