Location: Judges-I Samuel 8 **Reading Suggestion**: Judges 2, 3:1-11, I Samuel 8

Overview: "In those days there was no king in Israel; everyone did what was right in his own eyes" (Judges 21:25). God sent persecutors to Israel in the form of the nations around them (Judges 2:3). When the people repented or cried out, God sent a judge (a military adjudicator prophet) to deliver them. This period also sees a civil war against Benjamin (Judges 20). The last judge is Samuel, the first of the messianic prophets (I Sam. 9:9).

Foreshadow focus: Boaz is the foreshadow of the redeemer bridegroom (Ruth 4:14, Isa. 59:20).

Things you need to know:

- 1. The Judges Cycle
 - a. After Joshua's death, Israel descended into idolatry (ex. Jud. 17)
 - b. Cause of idolatry was the failure to destroy/remove the nations (Jud. 2:2-5)
 - b. Judges were both military and social leaders, but not kings
- 2. The Civil War
 - a. Decimated tribe of Benjamin over acts of the men of Gibeah (Jud. 20)
- 3. The Last Judges
 - a. Under Eli (presumed to be high priest, I Sam. 1:9) ark was lost
 - b. Samuel (also a priest) was the last judge (I Sam 8:5
 - (1) Samuel is called the 1st messianic prophet
 - (2) He may be the first to hold office of "prophet" (I Sam 9:9)
 - (3) He started the process of anointing ("messiah") the kings (I Sam. 9:16)
- 4. Ruth
 - a. David's Moabite great grandmother
 - b. Boaz mother was Rahab of Jericho
